AOTEAROA Who are Community Networks Aotearoa?

In November this year, Community Networks Aotearoa will celebrate a special birthday. Forty years ago the NZ Council of Social Services, as it was then known, was established by the government of the day under the Department of Social Welfare Act 1971. Initially a quasi-government body, NZCOSS emerged as a fully-fledged voluntary organisation a decade later when various COSS community representatives took ownership of it following its disestablishment by government.

This move was welcomed by government who provided funding for the inaugural NZCOSS conference and AGM, and the employment of a part-time staff member. NZCOSS thus took its place as a national social service umbrella organisation a role it continues to fulfil to this day.

Although 2014 saw a name change to Community Networks Aotearoa, our focus and energy remains in providing local and regional social service networks with information, support and a national voice; encouraging the development of networks in new areas and more generally acting as a conduit for social change and community development.

With over fifty member organisations throughout the country, CNA brings together some of the smallest, least well represented groups with some of the largest networks. With a staff of two and an Executive Committee from around the country, and the support of our Kaumatua, we see ourselves as the voice of the regions and work hard to ensure that voice is clearly heard in as many places as possible especially Wellington where policy is often set and political will influences us all.

To do all this successfully we rely on our membership keeping in touch with us and look forward to meeting them as often as possible either via travel to the regions, at our biennial sector-wide conference held in various locations, or at our Hui which is held in Wellington in alternate years to the conference. We also try to keep the conversation going via our two newsletters, Access radio programme, website, Skype and social media (Facebook and Twitter) and of course we are also only a phone call away! Sign up now for text alerts

It takes just a couple of minutes, but a simple step taken now could make all the difference in a major emergency.

Emergency Management Southland advisor Craig Sinclair is urging Southlanders to sign up to a text alert system, which will provide Southland Civil Defence warnings directly to mobile phones.

In the past a Civil Defence siren was used to notify the Invercargill public of an emergency, but the text message system covers the whole of Southland and is more reliable.

Mr Sinclair said while the government is considering larger scale options for alerting the public in the next few years, the emergency text system (operated through Twitter) is currently being operated on a local level for the Southland region.

Texts will be sent to registered numbers in the case of flood alerts, major weather warnings, tsunami alerts and other potential emergencies. It will be a simple text alerting people to the issue, with recipients directed elsewhere for any additional information.

"This isn't about providing people with the detailed information they need to get through in an emergency situation, but rather alerting them to a developing emergency or warning them of potential danger."

Once alerted, people would then need to access information online or via local radio stations, depending on what is available.

Mr Sinclair said signing up to the text service is simple and quick, requiring people to simply text the word **start** to**8987**, then follow the instructions until they receive a username. Once they have been sent a username, they simply need to reply **follow cdsouthland**.

Once this is completed, texts will be sent automatically when they are issued.

HOT CHOCOLATE TEACUPS

marshmallows

lifesavers
ginger nut biscuits

chocolate flake to decorate




Method:

Cut life savers in half and put aside. Melt some of the white chocolate discs in a microwave safe bowl for 30 second spurts until melted. Now let's put it all together.
